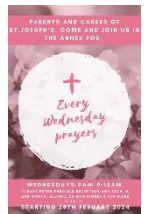

Attendance (95%) at St Joseph's this week has been achieved by two classes but.... **Well Done to Tydfil Sant with 95.19%!**

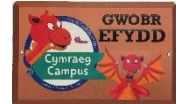
