In the prayers this week, children will invite the Holy Spirit to help them to look back with thankfulness, to be present with gratitude, and to look forward with hope and excitement. <b>15 September</b> John 3:13-17	<b>Symbol of Love</b> Children will explore the meaning of the Cross as a symbol of love and hope. The Cross reminds us of the love the Father has for each of us as we remember that He sent His only Son so that we can know His mercy and love.	<b>Never Forget!</b> <i>Psalms 78(77):1-2,34-35,36-37,38</i> Inspired by Psalm 78, children will be invited to remember and give thanks for the wonderful things the Lord has done for each of us. <b>22 September</b> Luke 16:10-13	<b>Focus on God</b> It can be hard to focus on God when our hearts are distracted! In this week's Gospel, Jesus recalls the two most important commandments - love God and love your neighbour. Children will learn that removing earthly distractions can help us focus on putting God first in our lives, which in turn helps us to love our neighbours well.	<b>Pray like Paul</b> <i>1 Timothy 2:1-8</i> God's desire is that each of us will be saved and with Him for all eternity. <b>29 September</b> Luke 16:19-31	<b>Rich Man, Poor Man</b> This assembly helps children understand the secret of true wealth: their faith in God and the gifts He gives us. Through the parable of the rich man and the poor man, children will explore how God wants them to live life to the full now and for eternity!	<b>Listen And Believe</b> In this week's Gospel, Jesus calls us to listen and believe. This prayer time makes space to listen to the words of the prophets and let our faith rise as we hear encouraging messages about Jesus from the Old Testament.	Let Us Pray... inspired by the Angels
<b>6 October</b> Luke 17:5-10	<b>Depend On God</b> Sunday's Gospel reading tells us that it doesn't matter how big or how small our faith is; in fact, even with faith the size of a tiny mustard seed, God can do amazing things. This is because the results don't depend on us - they depend on God.	<b>Mysteries of Light</b> This week, through praying the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, children will reflect and invite the Holy Spirit to increase their faith! <b>13 October</b> Luke 17:11-19	<b>Respond With Faith</b> Faith requires us to be expectant both that God will hear us and that He will respond. Through a dramatisation of the healing of the ten lepers, this assembly explores how having gratitude for God's gifts to us help us to recognise that He is our Saviour.	<b>Sing Out Your Praise</b> Psalm 98(97):1,2-3b,3c-4 The focus of the prayers this week is joyful thanks and praise as we remember that all good things come from God. Each day, children will have the opportunity to recognise God's goodness in their lives, and respond with a song of joyful thanksgiving.	Let Us Pray... in Our Own Way (Singing)
<b>20 October</b> Luke 18:1-8	<b>Keep Going</b> Through explorations of the parable of 'The Persistent Widow' and the fable of 'The Tortoise and the Hare', children will discover that not giving up on prayer leads to a deeper relationship with God. God invites us to talk and listen to Him, because He longs to answer our prayers.	<b>I Know That God Loves Me</b> Through their prayers this week, children are reminded that God's love never fails, it never gives up, and never runs out on us. <b>17 November</b> Luke 21:5-19	<b>Brothers and Sisters</b> This week's Celebration of the Word assembly asks the question, 'Who do we look to in times of trouble?' Through a real child's experience, children are encouraged to look to God and responsible adults for support. Also highlighted is the work of Aid to the Church in Need, who support persecuted Christians around the world today.	<b>I Trust in Jesus</b> Joshua 1:9 In this week's Gospel, Jesus warns His disciples of difficult times ahead. Our prayers, inspired by the 'Litany of Trust' from the Sisters of Life remind us that even in times of trouble, Jesus is always there for us.
