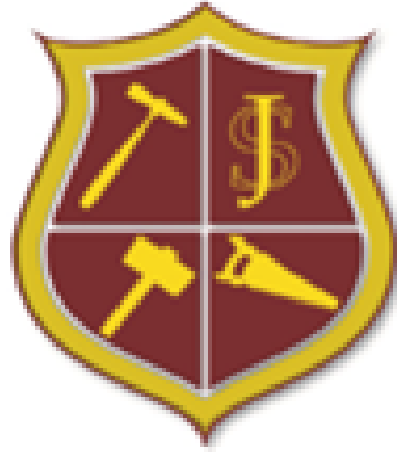

To achieve this the school will:-

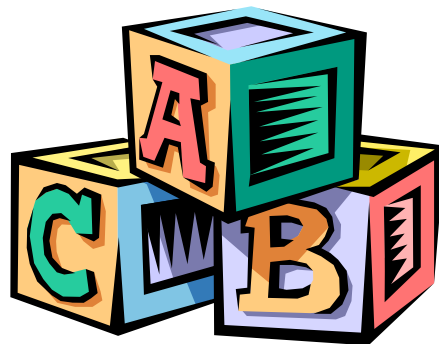
- Encourage each child to develop a relationship with Christ through prayer, worship and awareness of the Scriptures.

Our main aims for your child are:

- To ensure a safe and happy environment where your child is provided with a variety of activities which will enrich their development.
- To enable your child to confidently draw on lots of new experiences in their learning.

- To introduce your child to the Foundation Phase curriculum and introduce your child to the routine of school life.
- To encourage your child to make their own choices enabling them to become more independent.
- To prepare your child for mainstream education.
- To develop a good relationship between home and school.
- To encourage links between nursery and the wider community.
- To build upon the foundation of learning already laid at home and provide a stimulating environment for inquisitive minds in which your child will acquire a variety of basic skills.



Prayer forms an important aspect of our Religious Education work.

Time is spent each day in class praying together.

At St Joseph's Nursery we follow the 'Come and See' Religious Education Programme.

Our World



The aim of the programme is to provide a systematic presentation of the Christian event, message and way of life, in an appropriate way, according to the age and stage of development of the individual child. It aims to help members of the next generation to have a deep love and knowledge of Christ which will enable them to be joyful witnesses to him in the world.

We do encourage you to take your child to Mass every Sunday morning or Saturday Evening.

We follow the Foundation Phase Framework for Children's Learning.

The seven Areas of Learning are:

- Personal and Social Development, Well-Being and Cultural Diversity
- Language, Literacy and Communication Skills
- Mathematical Development
- Welsh Language Development
- Knowledge and Understanding of the World
- Physical Development
- Creative Development.

The Foundation Phase places great emphasis on developing children's:

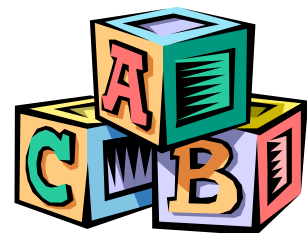
- Skills and understanding.
- Personal, social, emotional, physical and intellectual well-being, in order to develop the child as a whole.
- Positive attitudes to learning so that they enjoy learning and they will want to continue with their education for longer.

- Self esteem and self confidence to experiment, investigate, learn new things and form new relationships.
- Creative and expressive skills and observation to encourage their development as individuals with different ways of responding to experiences
- Activities in the outdoors where they have first hand experiences of solving real problems in maths, science and learn about conservation and sustainability

How to Prepare your Child for Nursery

Encouraging pre reading skills

- Share and enjoy books together
- Tell the stories from the pictures
- Discuss the author
- Encourage your child to join in familiar phrases eg. 'We're going on a bear hunt, we're going to find a big one'.....
- Point to the words as you read this reinforces left to right orientation.



- Encourage your child to discuss the characters and events in the book.
- Encourage your child to make predictions 'What do you think will happen next?'
- Encourage your child to be aware of the wealth of language all around them. Point out signs, labels shop names etc.

Encouraging number skills

- Sing together number rhymes and songs this is a fun way of counting
- Read stories which help to develop mathematical language such as *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*, *The Three Little Pigs*.
- Encourage your child to count whenever possible- counting buttons on their coat, stairs to bed, toys as they put them away.
- Point out numbers that you see in the environment eg, house numbers, buses, in the supermarket.

Encouraging pre writing skills

Your child will only make marks but this is the first stage of writing.

- When you go to the supermarket let your child make a list
- Encourage your child to use a variety of different mark makers eg. felt pens, paints, chalks, thick pencils and crayons.

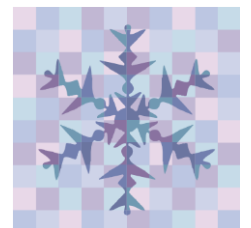
Strengthening fingers

Finger strength is a fundamental building block in the development of fine motor skills. Ways to develop finger strength include:

- Threading
- Use of playdough - pressing, rolling, moulding, squeezing, twisting
- Cutting
- Picking up small objects with thumb and finger, tweezers

Encouraging Independence

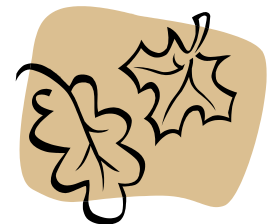
- Encourage your child to put their coat on and off
 - Ensure your child can ask to go to the toilet □



Encourage your child to tidy up after themselves. □ Ensure your child can express their own needs.

Encouraging scientific skills

- Talk with your child about their environment and help them to be aware of the changes taking place during the seasons.
- Give your child plenty of hands-on practical experiences eg. water play, building/construction, nature walks.
- Encourage your child's natural curiosity.



First Day in Nursery

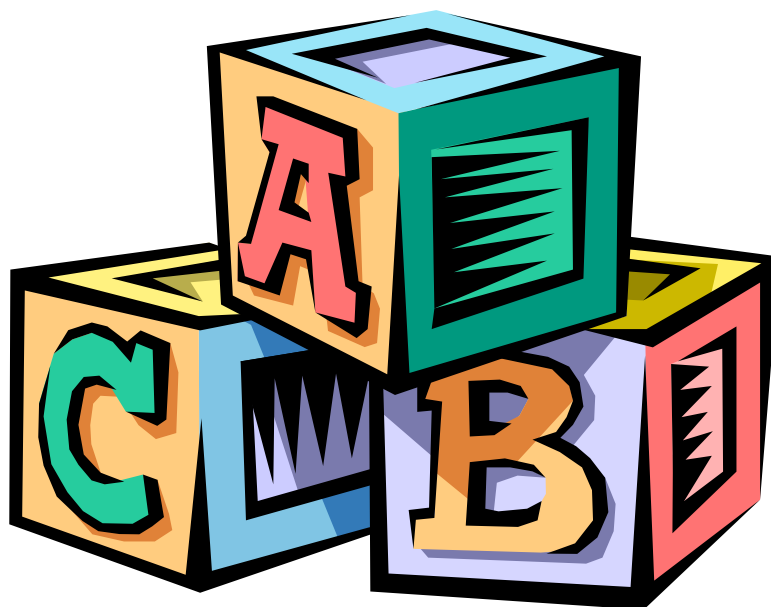
We try to make your child's first day in nursery as happy as possible; it is a key day in both your life and your child's.

When you bring your child on the first day, you will be shown where your child is to hang their coat.

Your child may be a little upset on their first days and it is easier for both you and the child if you leave them quickly. They generally settle fairly quickly.

If you wish, we are happy for you to ring us to put your mind at rest.

Nursery Day

Morning session

- 9.15am - 11.35am.

Afternoon session - 1.25pm - 3.45pm.

Both the morning and afternoon sessions run as follows: Children self register and explore some of the activities put out for the day.

The children then have carpet time, sing prayers. This is followed by a focused activity, inside and outside and a choice of creative work, construction, puzzles, water, paint, sand, music, choosing-reading of books, computer/ICT, or free play with the many and varied structured play materials. Children are encouraged to learn through practical experiences, both inside and outside, wherever possible using real life situations. PE takes place weekly and children will be required to change into shorts and t-shirt.

Then they tidy up and all children are expected to help clear away.

During snack time the children are offered milk/water and share their fruit.

We gather together, share work, listen to a story/singing.
Prayers.

Throughout your child's time in Nursery, most of their recorded work or art work will be kept in their book 'A Journey through Nursery'.

In the nursery we have a wide variety of areas including:

- Quiet area
- Home corner
- Areas for sand/water
- Role play area
- Book corner
- Table top activities
- Writing area
- Maths area
- Construction area
- Computers/white board

- Creative area
- Digging area
- Sensory area



Your child will spend a lot of time playing, but remember, they are learning to share, to take turns, develop independence and care for other people.

At certain times of day, your child will come together with the rest of the children, as part of a small group as well as the whole class. This gives your child a sense of belonging and encourages their social skills by giving him/her the opportunity to join in discussions, prayers, songs, stories, music and movement.

We cannot take responsibility for jewellery worn by children. Therefore, it is advisable that no jewellery be worn to Nursery. We are, as a school, expected to adhere to this Health and Safety legislation.

Grey trousers/joggers/skirt/pinafore

A large part of our day is spent outside so please ensure that your child is sent to nursery in appropriate clothing for the weather.

Winter: coat, scarf, gloves.

Summer: hat, sun-cream

NB: We are not allowed to put sun-cream on your child.

Each day your child will be encouraged to brush their teeth, as St Joseph's are part of the Welsh Assembly Project to lessen tooth decay in children.

**It is extremely important that a responsible adult
who is known to staff and your child**

comes to pick him/her up. Children will only be released from Nursery to adults who are named on the alternative pick up sheet and have signed their permission for the school to have their contact details..

Please try to bring your child every day as Nursery places are in great demand and he/she may become unsettled if attendance is irregular. Also, your child will be missing out on vital early years skills, which then means they will be at a disadvantage compared to their peers.

However, if your child is ill and is going to be absent please let us know by ringing the school secretary on 02920621625

Should your child have had sickness or an upset tummy, please keep them home for at least 48 hours.

We do ask each child to contribute £1 a week for Nursery funds. With this money, we are able to cover costs for

baking, special treats throughout the year and to repair and renew equipment and toys.

We also ask children to bring in a piece of fruit each day to eat as a snack with their milk. This provides them with necessary experiences such as sharing, discussion and healthy eating.



You can help us by.....

- Bringing your child to and from nursery on time.
- Letting us know if somebody different is picking up your child from nursery.

- Letting us know if your personal circumstances change.
- Dressing your child in practical, washable clothes/uniform and shoes that are easy to put on and take off.
- Teaching your child to put on/take off their coat.
- Putting their name on your child's clothes.
- Not bringing toys/ sweets, personal belongings etc to nursery.
- Remembering that your child should be able to use the toilet without too much help.
- Working with us to eradicate any teething problems on entering nursery.

Home School Tasks.

These mostly take the format of art and craftwork. Your help and co-operation with these tasks is appreciated. These tasks help you and your child to work together. Remember to involve your child- the results are meant to be child-like!

Additional Learning Needs.

Each child's development both socially, emotionally, behaviourally, intellectually and physically will be carefully monitored and assessed. Every effort will be made within the nursery to meet any educational need.

If any problems do occur, we will discuss them with you and your help and support will be sought to ensure that both home and school work together to try and work through the problem.

If necessary, other professional help will be sought from outside agencies and you would be made fully aware of the steps that would be taken.
